



Rural Development Opportunities Fund

In August of 2019, the FCC voted to develop the Rural Development Opportunity Fund (RDOF), which essentially replaces the Connect America Fund II auction for distributing Universal Service Fund money to rural carriers. The main difference between the two is that any company delivering broadband and voice services can bid on the funding. This includes cable providers, public utilities and wireless companies.

The FCC's proposed \$20.4 billion RDOF will bring broadband to more than 6 million rural Americans. The funds will be distributed through a reverse auction process similar to that of the CAF II model. This type of auction promotes participation by small rural innovators, and helps the hardest to serve rural areas get high-speed broadband networks that will bring economic opportunity and help support future 5G technologies. The funds will be dispersed in two phases.

Phase 1

- \$16 billion
- Areas wholly unserved
- Companies offering the fastest speeds chosen first
- Prioritize areas with speeds less than 10 Mbps
- Prioritize Tribal Lands
- 6 million locations eligible

Phase 2

- \$4.4 billion
- Locations in partially unserved census blocks
- If phase 1 funding is not obtained, eligible to bid on phase 2 funds
- Will use Digital Opportunity
 Data Collection mapping process
